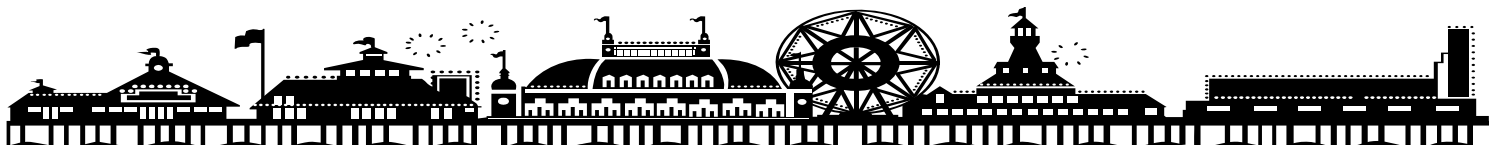

Rules and Regulations

1. All exhibits must be entered in the name of the bona fide owner.
2. To comply with State regulations, each Exhibitor or Entrant is required to furnish his/her social security number at the time of the entry. Failure to do so will result in immediate and absolute forfeiture of any and all ribbon/trophies, rankings, and premiums/prize money.
3. Open Classes shall be open to anyone who can comply with the registration requirements on livestock unless further entry requirements are specifically stated in the rules for a particular department.
4. All exhibitors must familiarize themselves with the rules and regulations and all entries are subject to the same.
5. Entries for Open Class and Junior Show exhibits may be made in person or by mail with the Secretary:

Payment of entry fees, pen or stall fees and Exhibitors Ticket must accompany entry form. (Entry forms on pages 53-57)
Notice: NO entries for open class competition will be accepted after 5:00pm on. If entry is being mailed, Exhibitor must allow for postal delivery time; the entry must be delivered to the Secretary on or before

THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED!

6. Exhibitors with entries shall contact the Department Superintendent upon arrival and shall place his/her exhibit where the Superintendent directs.
7. NO LIVESTOCK EXHIBITS ARE TO ARRIVE BEFORE 3:00PM ON THURSDAY, JULY 18 . All livestock exhibits must be in place by 8:00am on July 19, 2013 and may not be removed before 7:00am on July 21, 2013.
8. Entries will be accepted in the order in which they are received. Should entries in any department exceed the facilities available for proper handling, the Fair Board reserves the right to close entries in that department.
9. Exhibits of cattle and sheep must be accompanied by health certificates as prescribed by Illinois State Laws. An official State Inspector will be present to check all health papers on Thursday, July 18, 2013.
10. All exhibitors shall be held responsible for their own exhibits while on the Fairgrounds. The Fair Board will make every effort to prevent damage or loss to persons or property but assumes no responsibility for damage or loss from any cause. Night police will be provided.
11. Entries in all cases must be worthy of competition to be considered for premiums. Competent judges will be provided whose decisions will be final.
12. Neither this association nor any of its Officers or Directors shall be liable for injury to any person or property or any persons having license or privilege to exhibit on the Fairgrounds, to occupy space thereon, or to be present on the Fair grounds.
13. No person shall be permitted to sell, barter, exchange, or give away intoxicating liquor within jurisdiction of the Association; nor will gambling be allowed within the Fairgrounds. It is the duty of each Officer to enforce these rules.
14. The Superintendent of Concessions shall place all concessions. Her directive shall be final.
15. The Fair Board reserves the right to expel from the Fairgrounds and exhibits, concession, person or persons considered to be them as objectionable to the best interest of the Fair.
16. All livestock Judging except beef will be done on Friday beginning at 9:00am. Beef Judging will be Saturday : Heifer show judging at 8:00/ Steer show judging at 1:00pm. Judging of the Crafts & Gardening Department will be at 10:00am on Friday. The exhibit Hall will be closed to the public during judging of entries in the Craft & Gardening Department.
17. **No one is allowed to enter the Fairgrounds without showing their daily admission, season, or exhibitor ticket at the gate.**
18. Ribbons will be awarded in all livestock classes as follows:

Blue shall designate first premium	Red, second premium
White, third premium	Purple, Champion

Ribbons or tags in the same color will be awarded in the Crafts & Gardening Department.
19. In no case will premiums be advanced to an exhibitor. Payment will be made as soon as possible after the close of the Fair. Receipts MUST be signed by premium winners.
20. All bills against this Fair must be presented for payment within 30 days after the Fair closes and should be submitted to the Fair Board Secretary.
21. All checks issued by the Fair Association must be signed by the President or Secretary before being presented for payment.
22. The fair Board reserves the right to pro-rate premium payments any time the need should arise.
23. Any exhibitor guilty of harassment, verbal or physical, of any Fair official will be expelled with forfeiture of premiums.
24. The above regulations may be changed or other regulations added by a 2/3 (two- thirds) majority vote of the Directors.

Protests

All protests must be made in writing, setting forth the grounds for protesting, and subscribed and sworn to, and filed with the Secretary accompanied by a cash deposit of \$50.00. The Board of Directors shall constitute a Trail Board to consider all protest and all parties interested will be given a fair and impartial opportunity for presenting evidence in the case brought forth. In the event the protest is not sustained, the deposit shall be forfeited to the Association. No other protest will be considered by the Trail Board.

2013 Exhibition Livestock Health Requirements

General Requirements

1. Exhibitors are required to familiarize themselves with all rules applicable to their exhibits.
2. All out-of-state animals shall require an entry permit. Permits are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week by calling (217) 782-4944.
3. All animals, except as noted, shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) which shows that the animal meets all health requirements for State of Illinois. CVI's shall be made available to Bureau of Animal Health Personnel on request. CVI means a legible record made in an official form from the state of origin which has been issued, signed and dated by an accredited veterinarian and which shows the name & address on the animal's owner or exhibitor and the results of all required tests or vaccinations. A CVI shall list only one animal identification per line; shall be presented on the form on which it was initially issued; and shall not be corrected, changed or altered in any manner.
4. All animals shall be officially identified. The animal(s) official identification shall be recorded on the CVI.
5. If animals are from tuberculosis accredited, brucellosis certified, pseudorabies qualified, or brucellosis validated herds, the identifying herd number(s) along with the date of the last herd test(s) shall appear on the CVI.
6. CVI for out-of-state livestock shall be void thirty (30) days after issuance.
7. CVI for Illinois-origin livestock shall be void ninety (90) days after issuance.
8. All livestock shall be subject to examination upon entry to any Illinois fair or exhibition. Any animal showing evidence of infectious, contagious or communication diseases shall be immediately withdrawn and held in quarantine at the owner's risk and expense until property treated and recovered, or until the animal is released to return to the owner's premise. Any livestock infected with scabies, mange, active lesions of ringworm, soremouth, or multiple warts which are easily visible without close examination shall not be permitted to exhibit and are subject caseous lymphadenitis as evidence by draining abscesses shall not be exhibited and are subject to immediate quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds. Sheep and goats with caseous lymphadenitis as evidenced by draining abscesses shall not be exhibited and are subject to immediate quarantine or removal from fairgrounds.
9. Illinois Department of Agricultural personnel or designee may collect blood, tissue, milk or urine samples for the presence of illegal drugs or banned substances. New examination techniques, such as ultrasound, may also be used at anytime while the animals are on the grounds of any Illinois fair or exhibit. The Illinois Department of Agriculture personnel or designee may collect blood, tissue or other test samples from exhibition animals at the time of slaughter.
10. All exhibitors of animals at any Illinois fair or exhibition shall comply with the provisions of the Illinois Humane Care for Animals Act. If violations are observed, the animal(s) will be excused from exhibition & ordered removed from the grounds with all awards being forfeited. Any practice or deviation from normal, accepted care, including physical, medical or mechanical application, shall constitute a violation of show rules and may result in the animal(s) disqualification and removal from the Fairgrounds.
11. Any Illinois cattle, bison, cervidae, or goats being exhibited in non-accredited free states must be isolated from the remainder of the herd/flock upon return to Illinois and retested for tuberculosis 60-120 days post-entry.

CATTLE

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be either a fully healed and legible tattoo, official metal ear tag, registration number (can only be used if the tattoo is recorded on the registration certificate or for breeds where pictures are acceptable), or individual brands, if brand is recorded on the registration certificate.

Illinois Cattle

PLEASE NOTE: Illinois is a Bovine Brucellosis Class-free State. Illinois calves under 6 months of age, and Illinois steers are not required to have Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

Out-of State Cattle

PLEASE NOTE: Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis-Free State. Tuberculosis testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

1. All out-of-state cattle are to have an entry permit.
2. Permits are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week by calling (217) 782-4944.

Brucellosis

1. Female cattle six(6) months of age and bulls eighteen (18) months of age or older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within thirty (30) days prior to entry, unless exempt by one (1) of the following.
 - A. Originate directly from a certified brucellosis-free herd.
 - B. Official vaccinates of dairy breeds under twenty(2) months of age or official vaccinates of beef breeds under twenty-four(24) months of age.

C. Animal originated from a "Class Free" state (if entire state is so classified)

D. Steers and spayed heifers are not required to be tested for brucellosis.

2. The negative brucellosis test shall be conducted at a state of federal laboratory within 30 days prior to exhibition

Tuberculosis

1. Accredited Tuberculosis Free State

A. No tuberculosis test required. All cattle, including steers, originating from an Accredited Tuberculosis Free State, may enter Illinois or exhibition when accompanied by a CVI issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days.

2. Non-Accredited Tuberculosis Free Area or States (Not TB free)

A. Cattle must originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year.

B. The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to an additional tuberculosis test conducted within 30 days prior to exhibition.

C. Cattle that enter Illinois for exhibition and remain in Illinois (animal does not return to the state of origin within 30 days) must be isolated and retested for TB 60-120 days from the last official TB test date.

Brucellosis Illinois is a Bovine Brucellosis Class-free State.

Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

Tuberculosis Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis-Free State

Tuberculosis testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

SHEEP

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader. Ear tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal. When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded Scrapie Record Database.

Market Lambs

All wethers must be slick shorn (show ring ready) before weigh-in so that the show lambs fungus can be identified.

Illinois Sheep

1. Sheep originating from a flock that has been classified as either an infected or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon completion of an approved flock plan.

2. For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different. Out-of-State Sheep

3. All out-of-state sheep are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Permits are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week by calling (217) 782-4944.

4. Sheep originating from a flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved flock plan.

5. For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

GOATS

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader. Ear tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal. When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded Scrapie Record Database. Ears should be used for tattooing when possible. If there is no space in the ear, the flank or tail fold may be used.

Illinois Goats

1. Goats originating from a herd that has been classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited in Illinois upon completion of an approved herd plan.

2. For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

Out-of-State

1. All out-of-state goats are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Permits are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week by calling (217) 782-4944.

2. Goats origination from a herd that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited in Illinois upon completion of an approved herd plan.

3. Tuberculosis-Goats from areas or states that are not Accredited Bovine Tuberculosis Free, must be accompanied by a CVI indicating that the goats originated from a herd where a complete negative herd test has been conducted within the past twelve (12) months and the individual animals are negative to a tuberculin test conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry. For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

1. Health and Registry papers are required by State of Illinois regulations.
2. Fitting practices will be governed by the rules set forth by American Angus Association.
3. Entries must be property of the Exhibitor for 60 days or more.
4. Entries Shall Not Exceed Two Per Exhibitor In Each Class.
5. Steer weigh-in will be at 7.00am on
6. Show order will be determined after entries are received and will be posted
7. Any breed with 10 or more head entered, if owned by two or more exhibitors, will have their own breed show. In the event this is not met, classes will be combined and shown at the discretion of the Superintendent.

Every attempt will be made to provide permanent housing; however, if number exceed available space, temporary housing will be provided. Permanent housing will be assigned first to 2012 exhibitors, then on the basis of the date the entries are received. Onsite truck and trailer parking is available in a limit amount; if this is not adequate, secure offsite parking will be provided. All Exhibitors are expected to cooperate in this effort.

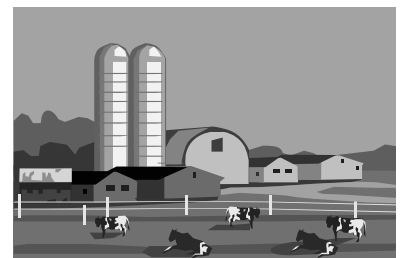

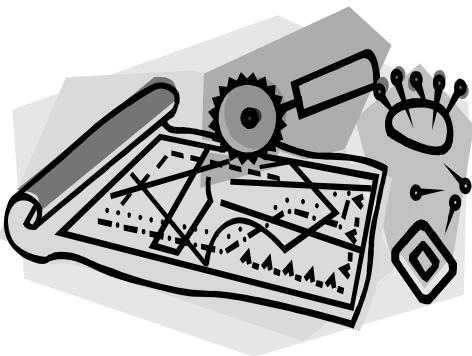

- 1) Trucks may pull a maximum of two hooks.
- 2) No entry fee money given back after class has started.
- 3) Registration closes 1/2 hour before pull starts. Late arrival fee \$5.00 per hook. Drivers meeting 15 min. before pull starts.
- 4) Alcohol or drug use is not condoned at Fantasy Truck Pulling events.
- 5) Unprofessional and/or unsportsmanlike conduct including abusive language and/or physical action by you, toward event official, track official, tech official, fellow competitor, sponsor or spectator will be just cause for total disqualification from said event. No money or points will be awarded for the event and you will be asked to leave.
- 6) No unsafe driving at any event, in the pit area, or on the track. No passengers allowed in or on the pulling vehicle while running. Any unreasonable or unsafe action will result in disqualification.
- 7) When the truck is running someone has to be in the truck at all times.
- 8) Working 2 1/2# fire extinguisher required in all trucks except Stock Class at all times.
- 9) First puller in class has option of pulling over in last position- if the sled is reset you still have the option to be 1st hook - when time allows-will be announced at drivers meeting. Must decide before unhooking from the sled. You will be allowed two attempts at pulling the sled within 100 feet. If your truck breaks on first attempt within 100 Feet, the puller is allowed to fix and return as the last puller in the class. On repull and pull off there is NO second chance.
- 10) Vehicle must stop upon signal from flagman.
- 11) Judges have the right to stop and disqualify any vehicle or contestant, or ask for truck to reweigh at any time.
- 12) All vehicles are subject to inspection randomly during the season.16. No one other than the flagman is allowed to stand on the track between the white lines when a vehicle is going down the track. The white lines do not end with the chalk lines- they extend to infinity and no one should be inside the lines whether visible or imaginary.
- 13) All trucks weighed with the driver that will pull in that class.
- 14) Weight classes will be 5800# and 6200# for Super Stock 2wd , 6000# & 6200# for Open Stock 4x4, Super Stock 4x4 is 6000# and 6200#. Mod 2wd. -see their rules. 8000# for diesel 4X4.
- 15) Weight that is added to vehicle for competition must be securely fastened. Any weight falling from the vehicle while chain is hooked will result in disqualification, unless you have the 1st puller option.
- 16) Any pulling vehicle leaving the staging area after being weighed and before hooking must reweigh and have their hitch rechecked. Any pulling vehicle turning down the 1st hook to rehook later in the class and leaves the staging area must reweigh and have their hitch rechecked. After truck is weighed, if more than 200#'s is moved, truck must reweigh and hitch remeasured.
- 17) If there is no floor in box, rear wheels must be covered with bed liner or tuneau cover.
- 18) Tires may be changed between classes.
- 19) Seat belts required in all pulling vehicles and must be worn while pulling.
- 20) Steel bell housing and block saver required with all clutches. Bell housing and block saver must be bolted together around bottom. All adjusting slots and holes to be covered with 1/4" steel and securely bolted. Must have safety blanket
- 22) All vehicles must have working reverse lights. Vehicle must have provision for neutral or park start only and have working kill switches.
- 23) Must have harmonic balance covers, unless S.F.I. approved, except stock class.

**NO EXCESSIVE SPEED ON OR OFF THE TRACK WHEN NOT HOOKED TO THE SLED.
ANY SUCH ACTION WILL BE GROUNDS FOR DISQUALIFICATION.**

- 24) Heavy duty clutches, auto shift kits, and high stall converters allowed. Explosion proof flywheels, clutches, and scatter shields are required. All drive line U-joints are to be enclosed in 360 degree shield - 5/16" aluminum, or 1/4" steel. All U-joint covers must be a minimum of 6" wide and a maximum of 2" clearance from U-joint. Shield should restrain any broken parts. U-joints should not be visible from side, top, or bottom. Drive shaft loops required. Loop must be constructed of 5/16" x 1" aluminum 1/4" x 1" steel, and mounted in such a position as to contain the drive shaft in the case of breakage - except stock class.
- 25) No vertical hooks allowed, must be horizontal (flat). No twisted clevises. All hitches will be checked with a legal fantasy stand. Hitches must be rigid in all directions.
- 26) No nitrous oxide, alcohol, or pressurized fuel allowed. Alcohol allowed in Mod 2wd only. Oxygenated fuel is allowed. No performance enhancing additives allowed.
- 27) No chrome molly frames allowed (except Modified 2 WD).32. No hemi heads.
- 28) No use of electronic traction control devices on pulling vehicles.
- 29) If chalk line goes past 300" you must stay within chalk line. If first puller in the class goes out of bounds, you may take the rehook. Past 300' without track markings you are not out of bounds. If sled pushes you out of bounds you are not DQ.
- 30) Helmets must be worn and strapped in Open Stock, Super Stock 2WD, Super Stock 4x4, Mod 2WD and Diesel classes. Fire jackets and long pants- (no shorts) - are required in all classes except stock. Fire pants are recommended. If caught not wearing protective fire gear or helmet by flag person while hooked to sled, -1SToffense is a verbal warning 2nd offense is DISQUALIFICATION.

GENERAL RULES

1. Driver must be 18 years old or older. Drivers between 14 and 17 must have written consent of parent/guardian for each pull unless there is a card on file with the officials. No one under 14 will be allowed to pull.
2. Obvious or excessive consumption of alcohol will be grounds for disqualification.
3. Any tractor or truck puller found to be unsafe or illegal will be disqualified or barred from hooking.
4. Only the track officials and the puller on the track.
 - Tractors must stay within bounds at all times
 - Track officials or the flag person will flag anyone who has a front tire above knee high.
5. Protesters must be from within the class. If a protest is made, it needs to be made prior to the class ending, with a \$50 up front fee. This money is refundable if the protest is positive or true.
6. Drivers must follow safety guidelines. Drivers must be firmly seated in the seat at all times in a forward or normal upright position. No bouncing permitted. Drivers must have one hand on the steering wheel at all times, except when operating brakes on hand brake tractors. Hands or feet must be in the general area of the clutch or brakes at all times.
7. Two(2) hooks per tractor and truck with the exception of open classes. The first puller of the day will have the option to rehook. Tractor may pull only once in each class.
8. Weights must not extend past the rear tires.
9. Tractors and trucks must be operated in a safe manner at all times. Speed not to exceed 4mph on and off the track. No extra riders on tractors or trucks on or off the track.
10. Foul language, threats or physical abuse to any puller or official will be grounds for permanent disqualification.
11. Tractors must be wheel driven, no crawlers, dual wheels, or steel wheels.
12. All fans, PTO or exposed moving parts must be shielded. Seats must be stationary at all times.
13. If anything falls off the tractor (weights/parts) while hooked to the sled, distance will be measured to the point. Weights should be firmly hooked to the tractor.
14. Judges or promoters decision is final at all times during the pull.
15. Pullers must be signed in prior to the start of their class.
16. Tractors and trucks must stop upon a red flag signal or be disqualified.
17. Tractors and trucks shall pull in order that they draw for position, There will be no waiting. If a tractor or truck is not in order, then it will be considered a courtesy pull. Lineup will be posted near the starting point.
18. Classes will be a cash payback-50% for the qualifying places.

Rules for each class:

1. 26" maximum high hook point.
2. Street stock tires only. DOT approved.
3. Must wear seat belt while pulling.
4. Any unsafe equipment on any truck may be ruled as a hazard and driver/owner will be DQ'd or modification must be removed before pulling.
5. Windows may be open but head and arms must remain inside.
6. No passengers allowed during the pull.
7. Fly wheel or bell-housing blankets will be permitted.
8. No shifting of manual transmissions while pulling.
9. ALL TRUCKS MUST CROSS THE SCALES BEFORE HOOKING TO SLED.
10. Trucks will be visually inspected prior to hooking to the sled.

LIGHT SMALL BLOCK

1. Street stock gas trucks only, must be licensed.
2. No turbos or superchargers.
3. Maximum weight 5500#, added weight must be on secured brackets.
4. No racing fuel or fuel mixture.
5. Hitches - DOT approved.

SMALL BLOCK STOCK GAS

1. Street stock gas trucks only, must be licensed.
2. No turbos or superchargers.
3. Maximum weight 6700#. Added weights must be on secured brackets.
4. Trucks will be visually inspected prior to hooking to the sled.
5. No racing fuel or fuel mixtures.
6. Hitches-DOT approved.

BIG BLOCK STOCK GAS

1. Maximum weight 7200#. Added weight must be on secured brackets.
2. No racing fuel or fuel mixtures.
3. Hitches-DOT approved.
4. Street legal-must be licensed.
5. No dualys trucks in this class.

7500# OPEN GAS

1. Weight limit 7500#.
2. This class is not included in the 2-hook rule.
3. Drive shaft loops, safety blankets and tether switches are mandatory.
4. Added weights allowed, but they must be on secure brackets.
5. Adjustable hitches allowed.

STOCK DIESEL

1. Maximum weight 7800#, added weights must be on secured brackets.
2. Trucks will be visually inspected prior to hooking to the sled.
3. If chipped, the chip must be disengaged.
4. Excessive exhaust smoke will be cause for disqualification.
5. Trucks with particulate filters not allowed.
6. To be diesel fuel only-no fuel mixtures.
7. Hitches-DOT approved.

1. Maximum weight 8000#.
2. Trucks may engage their chips, but diesel fuel only is allowed.
3. No fuel mixtures are permitted.

HOT DIESEL

2. Drive shaft loops, safety blankets and tether switches are mandatory.

Former County Fair Queens who have competed for the title of Miss Illinois County Fair are not eligible to participate.

Contestant agrees to appear on stage in a one-piece swimsuit, business attire and an evening gown, and agrees to present a speech up to 60 seconds in length; contestant will also be personally interviewed in business professional attire by the judges. All clothing must be viewed and approved by the directors prior to the pageant. Swimsuit must be one-piece, solid color and should fit well. Swimsuits with plunging necklines or too high on the hips are not allowed. If the swimsuit is questionable, the contestant will be requested to change it. Evening gowns are to be floor length.

Contestant will limit themselves to one piercing in each ear lobe. All other visible piercings must be removed or covered. All visible tattoos must be covered with clothing or body make-up.

No additional contestants will be accepted after the deadline.

Contestants are required to attend all of the rehearsals and workshops unless excused, in advance, by the pageant directors.

Contestants are required to pay a \$50.00 entry fee. This may be paid by a sponsor. Contestants will also be required to sell sponsorship ads for the pageant program.

Contestants are prohibited from displaying, communicating and/or providing or having knowledge of inappropriate language, materials or photographs on internet/web sites including but not limited to My Space, Face Book, or Personal Blogs. Contestant attests that any and all online depictions associated with the contestant name or likeness are consistent with the standards and dignity of The Miss Elizabeth Community Fair Queen Pageant.

The Contestant agrees that the time, manner and method of conducting and judging the pageant shall be solely within the discretion of the officials and that the decision of the judges shall be final.

The Contestant agrees that the personal data on the pageant application is correct and authorizes the use of the contestant's name, professional photographs and all pageant paperwork completed by the contestant to be used for publicity purposes for the pageant.

The Queen will be chosen and crowned the night of the pageant. No preliminary contest will be held unless deemed necessary by the Pageant Directors.

The newly selected queen will serve as hostess for The Elizabeth Community Fair; represent the Fair at the Miss Illinois County Fair Queen Pageant in January the following year and crown the next Miss Elizabeth Community Fair Queen. She will also make appearances as scheduled by the pageant director.
